Q 6. Which part of the Seal's body keeps it warm in colder seas?

A 6. A layer of fat and thick fur keeps the Seal's body warm in colder seas.

A 7. Cruel men hunt the Seals for their fur.

Q 8. Why does the Seal come ashore?

A 8. The Seal comes ashore to rest or sleep.

Q 9. Till when do Seals live on a beach once a year?

A 9. Seals live on a beach once a year till their pups are born.

Q 10. What are Seal pups taught to do?

A 10. Seal pups are taught to swim, find their meals, avoid Killer Whales and Polar Bears and not get entangled in kelp (seaweed).

Fun with words – Meanings in Context

ashore = on land, along the seashore

entangled = tied up or caught in something

frolicking = playing

kelp = a kind of seaweed, plant with long leaves that grows in the sea

webbed = having fingers or toes connected by a fold of skin
